BUILDING PERMIT FEES INCREASE

A by-law will be presented to the June council meeting to increase Building Permit Fees by 25% on June 10th, 2010 and 25% on January 1, 2011.

BROADBAND UPDATE

The County will be entering into an agreement with BXI regarding the second phase of the Broadband Program.

It is hoped that the work can start this summer to provide high speed internet to additional areas in the County. BXI (Barrett Xplore) bought the assets from Everus Communications.

Seniors in Dufferin County are eligible for a tax rebate if their property tax increase is over \$50.00. Contact our Treasury Department for more information.

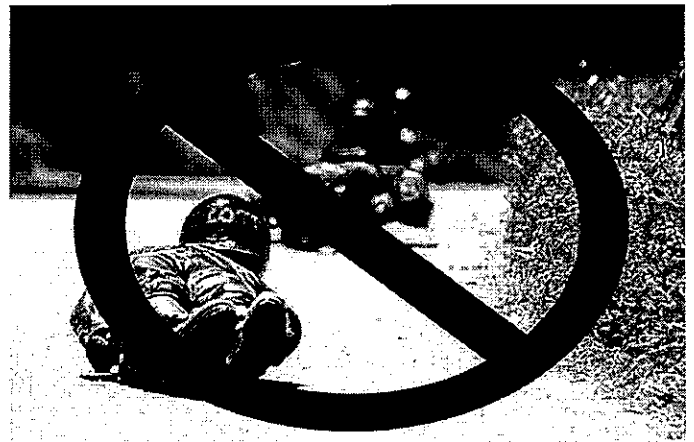
DRAFT CONSERVATION BY-LAW

The Museum Board submitted a revised Forest Conservation By-law which was amended and referred to the area municipalities for comment.

ENFORCEMENT OF STREET LUGING/COUNTY ROAD 21

Concern has been expressed with the actions taken by some adrenaline seeking individuals while lugging down the Blackbank hill on County Road #21. For those unfamiliar with the term street or road lugging, imagine a long skateboard that the rider lays on going down the incline feet first.

Council supported the request before the Ontario Good Roads Association and the Association of Municipalities of Ontario to support the request to revise the definition of "vehicle" under the Highway Traffic Act to include long boards/ street luges. In the meantime, the wording in the County's traffic by-law will allow the police to lay the appropriate charge so that the longboards/lugers can be prosecuted.
