RE: Official Complaint filed on July 20, 2009

I am writing with respect to the Council Meeting of Thursday February 17, 2011.

I was not in attendance at this meeting; however, it has come to my attention that the topic of resident complaints to the Township, concerning the turbines, was raised. I understand that you stated that Mr. Davoodian's recent complaint was the only of its kind that the Township has received since the turbines in phase one and two have gone operational in 2006 and 2008.

Mayor Hill, this is a completely false statement, and I have to say that I am shocked and horrified at the manner in which this Township has handled this situation, from the beginning.

I filed my Official Complaint on July 20, 2009, a copy of which is attached for your ease of reference, with Canadian Hydro, the Ministry of the Environment, Melancthon Township and the MPP for Dufferin County, Sylvia Jones. My complaint was forwarded to the Township via email, a copy of which is also attached, and was addressed to the Mayor at the time, Debbie Fawcett, as well as all of the Councillors, one of them being you.

To date I have received acknowledgement of, and/or a reply from, all of the above mentioned parties, with the exception of Melancthon Township.

Almost two years later, and after more bureaucratic run-around than I care to recall at this time, my complaint remains unresolved. As of September of 2010 I gave up on the theory that my elected officials would support and protect me, and I was left with no other option but to abandon my home and hire a lawyer.

I have been extremely disappointed with "my" Township for some time now and upon hearing the detailed events of the last Council Meeting, I am appalled. I have spent the better part of my life planning, saving and searching for the place that I would build my dream home and hang my hat for the rest of my days, and the past 10 years building it with my own two hands. It saddens me daily to know that my government has absolutely no regard for my home and my health, but to know that I have vested the whole of my being into a Township that would treat me this way quite honestly brings a tear to my eye.

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OFFICIAL COMPLAINT

Hello, my name is Roger Oliveira and I had a dream.

I knew in my early 20's that I wanted to move north and build my dream home. I was born and raised in the City, but undeniably a country boy at heart. I worked with my Father who was a Carpenter by trade for most of my life, and I naturally followed in his footsteps. This gave me the skill set and knowledge required to be able to one day realize my dream.

It was the late 1990's and me in my early 30's, I was financially ready and began looking for the perfect spot. I would need to be close enough to the city to commute for work, but far enough north to enjoy the country living lifestyle that I had been dreaming of for 10+ years now. My search took me all over Northern Ontario and was a 3 year process.

Finally in 2001... I found it!! A 1 Acre Corner lot Located in the Township of Melancthon. The next step was to go thru the process of obtaining Building Permits, and designing my home. For anyone that has gone thru this process, they will tell you that it is lengthy and sometimes frustrating, but worth the reward in the end (or at least suppose to be). In 2002 I started construction on my out building and in 2004 my home.

It was 2005 when I first caught a glimpse of phase 1. I was on my way home from work and saw what appeared to be these massive windmills being erected. I began to make inquiries, and came to find out that Melancthon Township had become the new home of a Canadian Hydro Wind Farm.

I had, and still have, a hard time understanding how this could have happened without me knowing. After speaking with the Township and asking this very question, they informed me that the residents of Melancthon were indeed notified, unfortunately for me the means of notification were not (in my opinion) appropriate.

The notification process consisted of:

- 1) A notice being posted on the Township website.
- 2) Notices being posted in the local newspaper.
- 3) A blurb in the Township newsletter that comes in the mail with your Property Tax Bill.

At no point in time was there ever a notice or letter sent to me, at my home. It was assumed that I would come across one of these methods of notification. I feel that this was very presumptuous of the Township and Canadian Hydro, this information **SHOULD** have been shared with residents via **Direct** mail, not left to the possibility that one might come across it.

So here I am, not even half way thru building my home and now I have these industrial turbines almost, but not quite, in my backyard. After much soul searching I decide to forge ahead, block out the images and concentrate on the things that reminded me of why I fell in love with this land. Difficult as it was I managed not to lose sight of my dream.

In early 2006, comes the news of phase 2... They are not done yet! And this time they will be right in my backyard, front yard, and both sides of my house. I am surrounded.

Now the turbines in phase one have been operational for approximately 1 year and residents have had an up close and personal experience with these massive industrial machines. They have quickly come to realize that they are not all they were cracked up to be.

After attending the Township and planning meetings for phase 2, there was definitely not a positive reaction to the news of more noise makers moving into Town. Residents managed to put up enough of a fight to halt it for a short period of time, but it is very difficult to fight a Township that wants the Revenue that is being offered, and a Corporation the size of Canadian Hydro. The offer is too good, the Corporation is too strong, and eventually Politics and Money win out over many of the residents wishes.

In December 2008 phase 2 went operational, and since then I have not slept thru the night. I have had to go to the Doctor and have sleeping pills prescribed so that I can get to sleep, but I am inevitably awakened each night.

My quality of life and enjoyment of my land and home has been adversely affected. I no longer look forward to coming home. I get a better night sleep in the city (go figure) and will spend some nights there, but why should I be run out of my home?

Summer is now upon us, I have always looked forward to this time of year. I look forward to the smells and sound, and being able to open all my windows and use Mother Nature's air conditioning. For this reason I do not have A/C in my home. Now the wind that I look so forward to each summer has become my enemy, and the sweet sounds of summer can no longer be heard for the noise of the massive industrial machines that surround me.

I have become intimately aware of the negative effects involved with living in a wind farm. If I yearn to hear the sounds of nature, I have to put my T.V. on the nature channel, turn it up, and close my windows and doors. I live in the middle of the Country!

The more I know, the worse the scenario is. I live in the middle of what sounds like an Airport only worse, at least if I lived next to the airport I would get a break every 30 seconds, and have 'No Fly' times in the night so that I could sleep. Between the constant whooshing that echoes thru the skies 24/7, and the humming sound that is omitted from the mechanics of the turbines 24/7, I have gone from being a very easy going and relaxed person to struggling on a daily basis with anything from stress to depression to anxiety over the thought of losing everything that I have worked for. In addition to this I now struggle daily with the effects of sleep deprivation, such as persistent headaches, ringing in my ears, digestive problems and chronic upset stomachs, to name a few. I have gone from being a healthy, lively and happy person to having all of these symptoms happen to me all at once, and persist for months on end. It is all a little too coincidental, don't you think? Even guests to my home experience similar symptoms when they stay for more than a day.

I lay awake at night and trying to figure out why this has happened. I have come here to realize what has been my dream for over 20 years, and it has turned into what would be a nightmare if I could sleep. Where do I go from here? I am not only financially bound to my home, but emotionally torn. As I consider my options (none of them good) I cry.

The Ironic thing about it is that I am not even done yet. Just to add a little insult to injury, I have to now finish my dream so that I can walk away from it for the sake of my health.

Why was there not a proper investigation done into potential health risks to people **BEFORE** putting these massive industrial machines in people's backyards. There is/was so much research available from existing wind farms around the world, yet none of it was taken into consideration. Had it been, they would not be so close to residences. The required setback in phase 1 was 400 meters, and was increased to 450 meters for phase 2. This is crazy, the Provincial Government is now 'Proposing' a setback of 850 meters from a residence, with a wind farm of this size, and even this is to close.

I have a total of 9 turbines immediately surrounding me, on all 4 corners of my property. #1. @ 481.8M, #2. @ 563.9, #3. @ 576.2 and #4. @ 619.6. Beside #2 is another one @ 700.5. The remaining 4 did not have distance readings available at the Township office, but are not too far from the 5 listed here (see map attached). I cannot go onto my property any time of the night or day **ever again** and experience the peaceful serenity and sounds of nature that made me fall in love with this place, and want to build my dream home here.

My goal with this letter is to bring awareness to the issues that I and many others are dealing with. For those that don't live in the middle of a wind farm, but merely drive thru one once in a while, my situation would be hard to understand. It is quite an awe to see for the occasional passer-by, but there is far more to this than meets the eye.

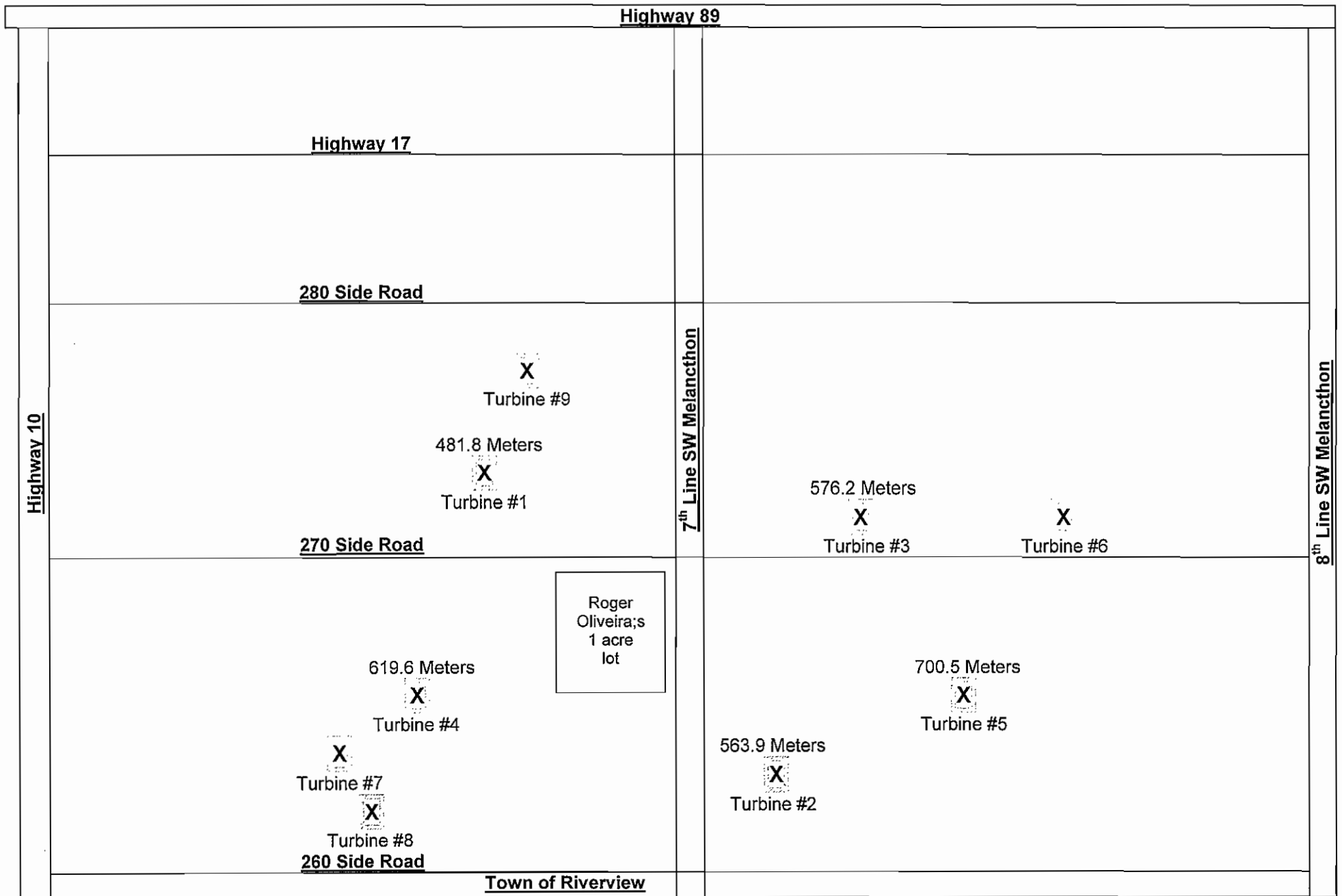

Thank you for your letter of February 24, 2011. I would just like to clarify one point regarding my comments made at the February 17, 2011 Council meeting where I said that we had only received one letter since "Phase II" went into operation.

Your original correspondence from 2009 is on file at the Township office and Council is aware of your concerns. I recall doing an on-site with the former Council to your property. Frankly, Council is at more of a disadvantage as a result of the Green Energy Act with no planning controls at the Township level, then when Phase II was implemented under an OMB Ruling.

You are correct. I was wrong and your letter was on file and I apologize for any frustration this may have caused.

You mentioned about coming to Council and you are more than welcome at any time, however this item will be on the March 3, 2011 Agenda as Correspondence for further action by Council and if you choose to attend that meeting, you would only be able to deal with this in Public Question Period, not as a Delegation.

Your concerns as well as others will be addressed with the Minister of Energy at the upcoming ROMA/OGRA Convention, which I and Deputy Mayor Darren White will be attending. A follow up report will be presented to Council and will be available for public review after the Conference.

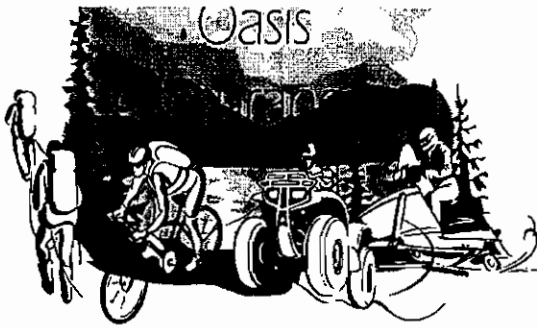



MUNICIPAL TRAIL VERIFICATION DOCUMENT

TOWNSHIP OF MELANCTHON

Dufferin Grey ATV Club attended a meeting on January 20, 2011 at the Township of Melancthon Office.

At this meeting, a Map of a proposed trail was brought forward to discuss the roads chosen to use as a trail in the Township and discussion about the use of the CP Rail Corridor. The Signage examples and insurance papers were also presented.

After some discussion and modification we approve the trail to be marked by the signage of 4" Green Diamond Shaped Markers with White Arrows on open roads and name of Club/OFATV signage on unopened roads. The signs will be placed on a stake on the right hand side of the road near intersections visible to a person on an ATV. Since the markers are placed on roads, "Stop Sign Ahead" and "Stop Signs" are not required nor is "Use at Your Own Risk".

It should be noted that this approval is only for trails on municipal property. Should the trail exit municipal property, the approval does not apply to that portion of the trail.

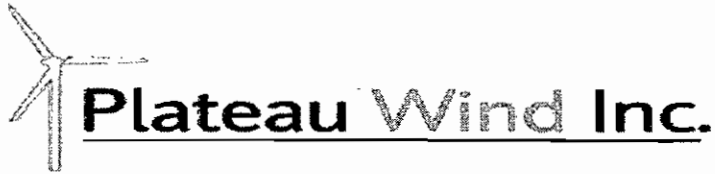

Mayor Hill, Council and Staff:

23 February, 2011

We look forward to presenting and discussing the next steps in the development of the Plateau III wind project. We have appreciated the opportunity to work with Council and Staff as the project has evolved. The previous site tour, update meetings as well as the completion of the Road Use Agreement (RUA) reflects our commitment to the value of working together.

Our company has had numerous meetings over the last few years with Hydro One officials (HONI). The goal has been to finalize with HONI where and how Plateau III generated power would be routed and connected to the local grid. Following these meetings there was the need to review and assess the implementation of these HONI decisions. We are now able to present the following for your consideration.

a) The Point of Connection (PCC) to the grid has been moved from the property of Mr. Paul Rew, Turbine 15, on Side Road 250 to a new HONI approved site on the property of Mr. Ken Holmes on 2nd Line SW between 250 and 260 side roads. (See attached Map) This property has been identified and secured with a Lease Agreement to construct the switching station. The property has received the necessary Archeological Site approvals from the Ministry of Culture. An application for the road access and building permits for this site are in process.

b) As in prior project site maps, the turbine generated power will be routed underground from the turbines to the designated side roads.

c) Once the power is at the side road there have been various alternatives discussed. We are pleased to present the following plan for review and subsequent inclusion as Schedule "A" & Schedule "B" of the road use agreement.

From Plateau III site along 250 Side Road to New PCC: (Buried – See Map to be inserted as Schedule "B")

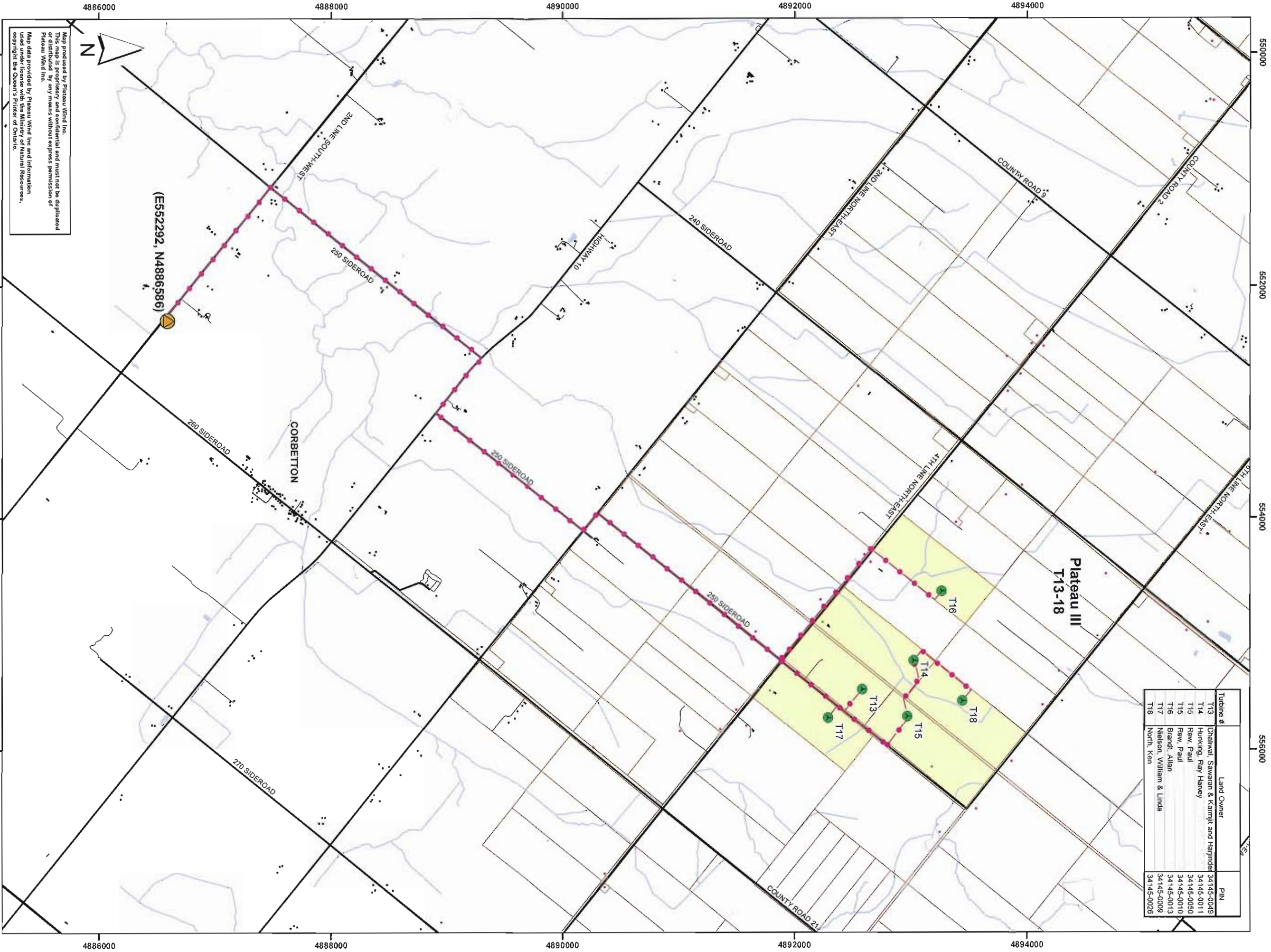
This below ground route (depth of 1.2m) is from site collection, west along 250 Side Road, around the corner of 250 and 2nd Line, west to Hwy #10. Permits from the Ministry of Transport (MTO) are being sought to go under Hwy # 10 and north along Highway #10 to 250 Side Road on the west side of Hwy #10. From there the power line would be buried along 250 west side of Hwy #10 and down 2nd Line SW to the PCC. The cable would be buried and the specific site details will be reviewed with Melancthon, Grand River Conservation Authority, HONI and Plateau Wind Inc. to minimize environmental impact issues such as root and vegetation damage. Load break switches will still be required at specific locations. This will involve the underground wires rising up a single pole at no more than seven specific locations. This alternative, though more expensive, was Council's preferred route as discussed on the initial site tour and in the Road Use Agreement discussions.

The above plan is the result of extensive study and review by all participating parties. As discussed with Denise Holmes, this alternative is the result of council's concerns regarding additional overhead power line improvements in the area. Should council be in agreement with this proposal, IPC would request that the proposal be brought before council and a motion to be put forth and accepted at the March 3, 2011 council meeting. In the interim, IPC will need to proceed with the GRCA permit applications required for this alternative. In order for this to take place; IPC will require cooperation from the township staff in order to advance the tributary permit crossing applications with the GRCA by Friday February 25 2011.

We would appreciate this information being reviewed as soon as possible.

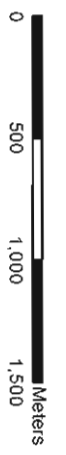

Dear Melancthon Council:

Thank you for hearing my question at your Council meeting on February 17, 2011.

Council suggested that they could send a letter to MOE and to TransAlta regarding the problems caused by IWT. It was also mentioned that Amaranth and Melancthon Councils could send a letter together.

There are many people in both townships who are suffering, therefore I would ask that a letter be sent with a very strong message that the people of these townships have suffered enough! That it is now time to turn the turbines off, we know MOE has the power to do this. On the radio a couple of weeks ago, Mr. Wilkinson said that the MOE does have the power to turn off the turbines.

In your strongly worded letter, it should be stressed that hundreds of complaints have been made to Spills Action Centre, I personally have sent over 120 complaints to the CHD/TransAlta noise complaint line (a recording) and I have sent just as many, if not more, written reports to both MOE (Guelph unit) and TransAlta. To send the written report, I follow a template sent to me by CHD/TransAlta. The message has been sent over and over again.

I understand that you feel the letter would not get results. I also know that we cannot surrender. The residents need help now Mayor Hill. We cannot wait for future meetings, troubleshooting sessions or feedback from other municipalities. It is the municipalities' job to protect the health and safety of its constituents. You clearly have a letter from someone suffering since the turbines started up. This person is asking for help. He has had a part of his family move away because of the turbines, his plea was accompanied by a doctor's letter describing their diminishing health and still you hesitate.
