Dear Melancthon Council please protect our township's water as recommended in the AEMOT study. They are currently not protected. Please protect our water resources by redesignating OS2 Open Space Conservation currently renamed "Flood Plain" offering no protection.

Please include migratory corridors for birds and adequate biodiversity protection rather than increasing gravel haul routes as Mr. Jorden has suggested. Please request that Aggregate Resource Areas on the maps be coloured something other than blue or green so that rivers, streams and ponds can be clearly identified. (Yellow might be best)

Mulmur already has a Specialty Crop Designation as part of their Draft Official Plan. (See below) Please insist that Mr. Jorden include the Specialty Crop Designation as recommended by Garry Hunter.

Mulmur's Draft Official Plan:

'6.1.6 Identification and Use of Specialty Crop Lands

Agricultural Areas may be designated as Specialty Crop Lands using evaluation procedures established by the Province, as amended from time to time, where specialty crops are predominantly grown, usually resulting from:

- 1) soils that have suitability to produce specialty crops, or lands that are subject to special climatic conditions, or a combination of both; and/or;**
- 2) a combination of farmers skilled in the production of specialty crops, and of capital investment in related facilities and services to produce, store, or process specialty crops.**

Areas designated as Specialty Crop Lands shall be shown on the schedules to this Plan, and shall be subject to the following additional policies:

Settlement Areas shall not be permitted to expand into areas identified as Specialty Crop Lands;

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Priority will be given to the protection of such lands for long term specialty crop production, over other lands, including prime agricultural lands, for the siting of other permitted developments and uses, including alternative energy generation projects, and pits and quarries;

The designation of lands as Specialty Crop Lands shall be supported by an agrologist's report confirming the appropriateness of the designation, acceptable to the Township and the Ontario Ministry of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs, by Amendment to this Plan and shall be placed into a separate zoning sub-category, under the "Agricultural" zone in the Zoning By-law. · Agriculture related and secondary uses listed in Section 6.1.3 e) and f), may be permitted on Specialty Crop Lands only by amendment to the Zoning By-law. Such uses shall not generally be permitted unless it can be clearly demonstrated that the use is necessary to support an existing specialty crop operation, that the use does not result in the consumption of significant areas of Specialty Crop Land, and that there is no reasonable opportunity to locate the use outside of the Specialty Crop Land area."

Subject: OP questions for Council

Regarding OP mapping, I respectfully ask Council to:

1) Please have Mr. Jorden research and report why the A.N.S.I. designation is missing from the aggregate overlay on the Melancthon OP map? (Areas of natural and scientific interest)

2) Please explain why Schedule D, the bedrock designation map, did not show Melancthon land north of the bedrock overlay designation. I believe this is the land which is scheduled for the proposed Highland 2400 acre mine? Is the map inaccurate or just incomplete? To what purpose?

3a) It has come to my attention that the bedrock designation map Mr. Jorden is using was prepared for the MNDM by the Highland Companies and is inaccurate in that it omits stats from specific bore holes (see Garry Hunter for elaboration on this); the fact that only the "primary aggregate resource" is indicated is questionable and troubling....and all too convenient for land owned by the Highland Companies. This matter needs Council's immediate attention. What steps will be taken by Council?

3b) Could you please explain to ratepayers how the Schedule D mapping, serving the specific agenda of the proponent, rather than the greater good of the community, can be used for the betterment of our Official Plan? Mr. Hunter has thorough and detailed maps that portray an accurate picture of the geological features of Melancthon. Will Council consider purchasing and implementing these maps into the OP? If not, why not?

4) I was particularly troubled by the lack of consideration to fauna and wildlife in the mapping. As stewards of Melancthon, how can we accept that "no endangered plants or animals" have existed, and/or continue to exist in Melancthon anywhere other than the 1 km square area mapped by Mr. Jorden, where "something" was "sighted" in 1927??? Does this mean our endangered species list has not been updated since 1929? This is simply irresponsible and, again, all too convenient for the Highland Companies, 401 Energy and any industrial corporation that has "big plans" for Melancthon. We must get an updated report on endangered plants and animals and it must be implemented into the OP. I myself have seen the following in Melancthon: lady slippers, a cougar, a snowy owl, snapping turtles, all endangered, and monarch butterflies...which are about to be added to the list of endangered species list. There are many more; they need to be identified and protected. Will Council pursue farther identification and designation of endangered and rare species of fauna and wildlife in the Melancthon OP?
